He further observed the event served the fundamental role to complement academics in order to provide a holistic approach to student life while developing their talents.


“The university is excited that the students are creating a culture of growth and development amongst themselves and we

"The training is designed to liberate young minds on the desired qualities that employers are seeking out today," observes Lameck Tala, Placement Officer at the university. Tala also notes that students are expected to present a well written CV and a cover letter following the training.

In addition, they are expected to prepare a detailed personal and a career development plan to enable them to analyze their strengths and weaknesses and use this information on deciding what industry they want to work in.

"The training is done thrice a week for sustenance of the message and once they are done, they receive a certificate of participation."
